Credits


Below are a few important things about High School and Credits

- High School Classes count for credits
 - You need 24 credits to graduate.
 - OMost semester class = .5 credit
 - Jazz Band and Treble Triad are only .25 credit = semester
 - You need to pass the class to earn the credit.
 - olf you don't pass the class, then you will have to retake the class to earn the credit.

Required Courses for Juniors

You will select 5 courses (plus 2 alternates)

- 1. English American Literature or AP Language/Comp.
- 2. Science Chemistry, AP Chemistry, Plant Science, Natural Resources, Animal Science or Veterinary Science, Physics;
 - **a.** There are Pre Requisite requirements for many Science courses please see the course description book to see if you meet all prerequisites before registering
- 3. Social Studies U.S. History or AP U.S. History
- 4. Elective #1 your choice
- 5. Elective #2 your choice

Courses to Consider:

World Language - This is not a graduation requirement, but most 4 year colleges and universities require 2 years of World Language (same language). Two Year Colleges or Trade Schools do not require this. If you are unsure of your plans, it would be best to plan on taking 2 years of World Language in High School.

P.E. - 1.5 credits of PE is required to graduate. It is a good idea to get these credits met **before senior year**.

Courses to Consider:

Have you taken a:

- CTE (Career & Technical Education) Course (1 credit is required)
 - In addition to Senior Year Career Choices
- Fine Arts (2 credits OR 1 credit FA + Personal Pathway)
- World Language or Personal Pathway
 - If you do not take 2 years of World Language as described on previous slide, then you will need to take 2 Personal Pathway Credits

What is a Personal Pathway Credit?

A credit from a course that aligns with your plans for after high school. This can be anything from additional CTE to Math to Science and other courses. It needs to tie into your High School and Beyond Plan.

Graduation Pathways

As you can see, there are several Graduation Pathways. If you are unsure of what Pathway you have met or hope to meet, please talk to your counselor.

State Testing

All juniors will take the WCAS - State Science exam.

If you have not met a Graduation Pathway, you will take the State Test (SBA) in Math and/or E.L.A. (reading and writing)

College Entrance Testing

- Due to COVID-19, Colleges and Universities around the nation have altered their entrance exam requirements. Make sure to check the requirements for each college.
- Many 4 year Colleges and Universities are going away from requiring an entrance test - SAT or ACT, but it is still a good idea to take this test if a 4 year college is in your plans. Talk to your guidance counselor if you are unsure.
- The spring of Junior year is an ideal time to take the test knowledge gained from Junior year courses and still time to retake (if you want) before college applications are due.
- The PSAT (Practice SAT) is administered at PHS in the fall. This is a good opportunity to practice for any timed standardized test and a top score could qualify for National Merit scholarships or recognition.

Dual Credit

PHS is expanding the *College in the High School* courses...

- High School courses taken for college credit right here at PHS
- Math, English, Science, Social Studies, and French are all working on College in the High School courses - take college credits, right here at Pullman High School!
- Junior and Senior classes are currently being considered.
- Stay at high school and earn college credits!

Dual Credit

Running Start

- Junior and Senior students may be eligible to take Running Start courses at Spokane Falls Community College or WSU (3.5 GPA or higher).
- College level courses taken for high school & college credit.
- Running Start Courses are tuition free lab fees, student fees, books, placement testing fees may not be included and will be the <u>student's</u> financial responsibility.

College in the High School

- Request your classes as usual.
- A full list of classes offered for 2024-25 will be available prior to school starting.
- Teachers will have sign ups in each of the classrooms next fall.

Running Start

- Create a full schedule in Skyward as if you were not doing Running Start.
- Email your counselor to let them know your plan.
- Schedule a meeting with your counselor to discuss possibilities.
