Credits


Below are a few important things about High School and Credits

- High School Classes count for credits
 - You need 24 credits to graduate.
 - Most semester class = $\frac{1}{2}$ credit
 - Jazz Band and Treble Triad are only $\frac{1}{4}$ credit = semester
 - You need to pass the class to earn the credit.
 - If you don't pass the class, then you will have to retake the class to earn the credit.

On the next page, you will see how many credits you need for each subject area.

Required Courses for Seniors

You will select 5 courses (*plus 2 alternates*)

1. English - World Literature/Composition or AP Language/Comp.
2. Social Studies -
Civics (semester)
AND
Economics or Psychology (minimum of a semester)
3. Career Choices - 1 semester + Elective (semester)
4. Elective #1 - your choice
5. Elective #2 - your choice

* **Math** - Current Math Teacher will select your math for next year, it may or may not be required, but it is highly suggested to continue - especially if you are planning on attending college

P.H.S. ZERO Period

Zero Period begins at 7:15 AM and there is no school transportation available

- *you need to find your own way to the school*

Email your school counselor if you want to add ZERO period class to your schedule!

The following classes are offered during ZERO period at P.H.S.

Jazz Band - Must also be enrolled in Concert Band or teacher permission

Treble Triad - Audition with Choir teacher

Blue Orchestra - Audition required

Courses to Consider:

Math - If you are going to a 4 year college or university, a senior year math course or quantitative science course is required - Please talk to your counselor if you have any questions about this.

Science - 3 credits are required, but many colleges want to see Science taken during your Senior year.

Chemistry, AP Chemistry, Plant Science, Natural Resources, Animal Science, Veterinary Science, Physics, Human Biology

There are Pre Requisite requirements for many Science courses - please see the course description book to see if you meet all prerequisites before registering.

World Language - Do you need a 2nd or 3rd credit? - This is not a graduation requirement, but it is a requirement for admissions into a 4 year college or university.

P.E. - 1 ½ credits of PE is required to graduate.

Courses to Consider:

Have you taken a:

- CTE Course *(1 credit is required)*
 - *In addition to Senior Year Career Choices*
- Fine Arts *(2 credits OR 1 credit + 1 credit of Personal Pathway)*
- World Language or Personal Pathway
 - *If you do not take 2 years of World Language as described on previous slide, then you will need to take 2 Personal Pathway Credits*

What is a Personal Pathway Credit?

A credit from a course that aligns with your plans for after high school. This can be anything from CTE to Math to Science and other courses. It needs to tie into your High School and Beyond Plan.

Graduation Pathways

Dual Credit

PHS is expanding the ***College in the High School*** courses...

- High School courses taken for college credit - right here at PHS
- Math, English, Science, Social Studies, and French are all working on College in the High School courses - take college credits, right here at Pullman High School!
- Junior and Senior classes are currently being considered.
- Stay at high school and earn college credits!

Dual Credit

Running Start

- Junior and Senior students may be eligible to take Running Start courses at WSU or SFCC.
- College level courses taken for high school and college credit.
- Running Start Courses are tuition free - lab fees, student fees, books, placement testing fees may not be included and will be the student's financial responsibility.

Dual Credit

How to Request Dual Credit in your Course Requests?

College in the High School

- Request your classes as usual.
- A full list of classes offered for 2024-25 will be available prior to school starting.
- Teachers will have sign ups in each of the classrooms next fall.

Running Start

- Create a full schedule in Skyward as if you were not doing Running Start.
- Email your counselor to let them know your plan.
- Schedule a meeting with your counselor to discuss possibilities.

After High School - College

SUMMER:

- Research colleges/universities
 - Location
 - Program of Study
 - Cost
- Research Scholarships

FALL:

- Apply
 - College Websites
- Ask Teachers and Counselors for Letters of Recommendation
- Fill out the FAFSA (more information to come in the fall)
- Research/Apply for Scholarships

After High School - Employment

- Start researching jobs you are interested in
 - Training Required?
- Build a Resume
 - Have an adult review it

- Start researching which branch of Military you would be interested in.

College Entrance Testing

- Due to COVID-19, Colleges and Universities around the nation have altered their entrance exam requirements. Make sure to check the requirements for each college.
- Many 4 year Colleges and Universities require an entrance test - SAT or ACT. You do not need to take both.
- The spring of Junior year is an ideal time to take the test - knowledge gained from Junior year courses and still time to retake (if you want) before college applications are due.

Senior Year

- Senior year is important! Make it a good year!
- Stay connected with your classes, teachers, friends, and counselor!
- Attendance in school is IMPORTANT!
- If you are applying to colleges or scholarships and need letters of recommendation, ask for letters early! Give the recommender a copy of your resume and plenty of time - to write you a good and personable letter.
- Just because you have been accepted to a college, doesn't mean you can let your classes or grades slip! Keep up the good work, colleges will get your final transcript in June!
- Mrs. Komp will send out a Google Classroom for the Senior Class - JOIN IT - this will be your last year of high school - have fun!
