

Pullman High School Course Based Dual Credit

What is Dual Credit?

- In course-based dual credit, a student enrolls in a class that has the potential to earn both high school and college credit. Course-based dual credit classes can be offered at the high school (College in the High School and Career and Technical Education Dual Credit) or college (Running Start).

Pullman College in the High School

- College in the High School courses are college-level courses taught by high school teachers in the high school and available in some classes at the high school. Colleges partner with the high school to approve teachers and ensure course content, outcomes, and rigor are comparable to those of the corresponding college course. Students have the option of earning college credit while completing these courses or taking them for high school credit only. Beginning in the 2023-24 school year, all public-school students enrolling in CHS for postsecondary credit through approved public colleges or universities may do so at **no cost**. **Students can earn college credit right here at PHS without leaving the building!**

PHS College in the High School Courses

Pullman CTE Dual Credit

- CTE Dual Credit courses are taught at the high school by high school teachers and are approved by Walla Walla Community College. The High school and college enter into articulation agreements that ensure courses taken align with college programs, prepare students for careers and/or postsecondary education, and can lead to college credit. These courses fall within a career pathway and can move a student towards completion of a certificate or degree in that field.

Pullman Running Start

- Running Start is a program option consisting of enrolling and attending college courses to earn high school credits. Upon approval, students in grades 11 and 12 can take college courses at Washington State University and Spokane Falls Community College Pullman Campus. Tuition is covered by the state, however other class and course fees are the responsibility of the student and/or family.
